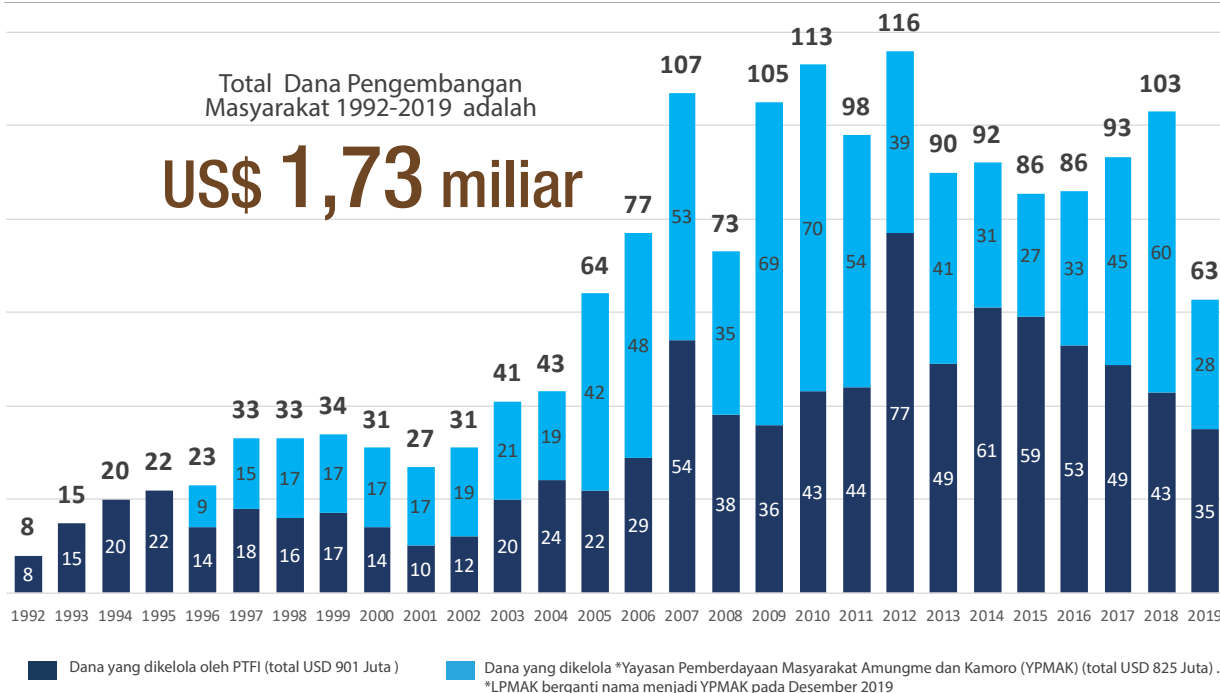


# Pengembangan Masyarakat

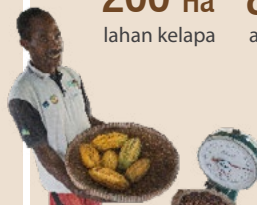

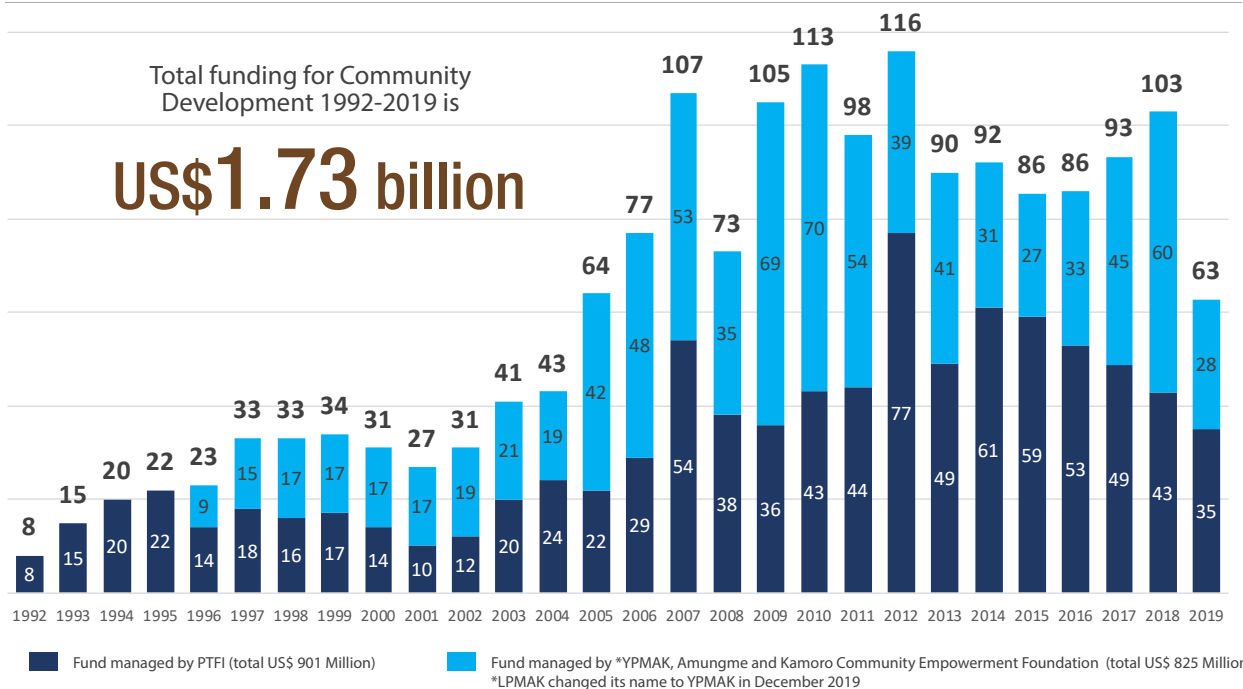

# Community Development



When PT Freeport Indonesia (PTFI) began operations, the Mimika population was below 1,000 people. Since then, Mimika has experienced some of the greatest migration in Indonesia. Today, PTFI continues to be the primary economic driver in Papua.
